“John Ridgway, Samuel Chip, Edward Colthurst, and one Stanly, not before the Court, were indicted for the wilful murder of an aboriginal native youth, called Tommy, at Miau River, near Port Stephens, on the 8th day of May last”.

“Execution- on Monday, the 31st of December, 1827, five unfortunate men were executed at Sydney; namely Jonathan Carrington, William Lee, and James Charlton, for burglary; Michael Pearce, for a highway robbery; and Tommy, a black native, for murder- This aborigine had nearly effected his escape the preceding day, and denied all participation whatever in the murder”.
