Toby, an aboriginaine of the Illalaung tribe, was indicted for assaulting Mr John Lynch, a settler at Sugar-loaf Creek, Brisbane Water; and also for stealing from his dwelling house, on the 5th November.

Two aboriginal natives, named **Toby** and Murphy, were convicted at the Maitland Quarter Sessions of highway robbery. They have both been under sentence before, one at Goat Island, and the others at Newcastle.

Maitland Quarter Sessions

- **Toby** and Murphy (aboriginal natives) were indicted for a highway robbery, on the person of Thomas Cottrell, at Maitland, on the 21st of October last.
- The prisoner Toby had been very recently released from Goat Island where he was undergoing punishment for a similar offence.
