Memorandum

15 On Wednesday ^{morning} Oct 8th myself and Miller were ordained as Messengers to the Heathen. —

16 The Atlas sailed from Deptford to take up convicts from Woolwich, Sheerness and Portsmouth, at which latter place we are to embark for New South Wales. —

17 Left London for Gosport on Friday noon arrived in the evening. The Atlas arrived the same afternoon with loss of 2 inches and 1 cable. expect to sail on the Friday or Saturday following.

16 Draw a check upon the
Gosport Bank for 10 £
for myself and 10 £ for
we appeared J. Hancock

19. Embarked on board the *Albatross*

21 Gave testaments for the
use of the Hospital.

23 Came on shore again.

25 Went on board again. viz

28 Came on shore again as
Dysentery has broken out
among the convicts.

30 Drove on Mt Hancock to

Jan 12 1816. Drove for 10/

21 Came on board again

Set sail confined with
sickness from the 24th to
Feb. 3.

3 Gave testaments and
tracts for the use of the
parson in the ships.
Preached in the prison to
the convicts from 5th to 20th

5 Three convicts were seized
for taking off their iron.

6 Peter the cabin boy fell
over board and was drowned
puffed several sail the
weather very squally.

9 Saw a shoal of Porpoises

13 Came in sight of Porto
Santo & the Deserters

Feb. 7

14 Touched at Madera

18 Mr Ellis preached to the
Convicts. I preached in
our state rooms from
1. Peter For Christ as
once suffered &c

19 Saw a whale and seven
Portuguese men of war
at 5 minutes before 10 in
the evening Mrs Howe
was safely delivered of
a daughter.

22 Saw the Cape de Good
Islands.

24 Saw several flying fish

March 3. Sunday.

Crossed the line at 3 o
clock in the morning.
Mr Ellis preached to the
convicts. -

4th The usual ceremony
of Shaving &c on account
of the ill behaviour of
the sailors we gave them
nothing. -

10th Sunday Preached to the
Convicts from Heb. 9. 27-28.
Mr Ellis preached in the Cabin

11th Saw a Shark -
caught one this afternoon
about 6. or 7 feet long -

16. Saw a Galleon

17th Sunday. Mrs J. was
safely delivered after a
tedious labour of 14 hours
of a Son. ^{born} ~~born~~ ^{at 3.30} ~~at 3.30~~ ^{at 19.2}
at 1/4 before 10 at night

20th Anchored at Rio Jano

31st Preached to the convicts
from Luke 11-35.

April wrote by the ^{Packet} ~~Indisdependence~~

20th Left the Atlas at Rio
Jano to stay at that place
for a short time that
my wife and child
may recover their strength
took lodgings at Mr Walsh's
at the rate of 10 mill four

It is my opinion that the
life of Mr Northwell's child
would be endangered by
